



If you have been convicted of Operating While Intoxicated (O.W.I.) while operating a vehicle, motorcycle, or boat, chances are you have been court-ordered to receive an assessment.

You may be facing potentially serious consequences and this can feel overwhelming and stressful. Knowing how our process works may help relieve some of this anxiety.

## What Are Your First Steps?

### Determine where you need to schedule your assessment:

- **If you are a resident of Dane County, WI,** contact Journey's Clinical Assessment Unit to set up an appointment for an assessment. There are two ways to do this:
- Complete this online form: **"Clinical Assessment Unit Appointment Request"**

At your appointment, you will complete a substance use history, an alcohol and drug questionnaire, and a mental health assessment. Your appointment will last approximately 45-90 minutes depending on the details of your case and circumstances. During this time, we will further explore the context of your alcohol and drug use, as well as the impact it is having on your life. Based on what is learned, recommendations will be made for follow-up education and/or treatment as part of your driver safety plan to address any concerns related to your alcohol and/or drug use.

- **If you are NOT a resident of Dane County, WI, but instead a resident of a different Wisconsin county,** you must be assessed in the county in which you reside in. For a list of assessment facilities in Wisconsin by county, go to **<https://www.dhs.wisconsin.gov/idp/directory.htm>**
- **If you received a DUI (Driving Under the Influence) in Illinois,** you must be assessed in Illinois. Please contact the Illinois Division of Alcoholism and Substance Abuse general number at 312-814-3840.
- **For out of state residents,** please contact the Department of Transportation for your state and ask for the assessment facility for your county.
